In case of person in the water, or potential drowning: Do Not Call 911 if a person just falls in, but is not injured - help them get out. Water exit ladders are placed around the docks to help people get out. In addition any boats swim platform may be used if needed.

- Life Rings are available at head of North Pier by pool, and South Pier by Patio

- Get assistance from other boaters to get an incapacitated person out of the water

- If the person is injured - call 911, and if not breathing, begin CPR

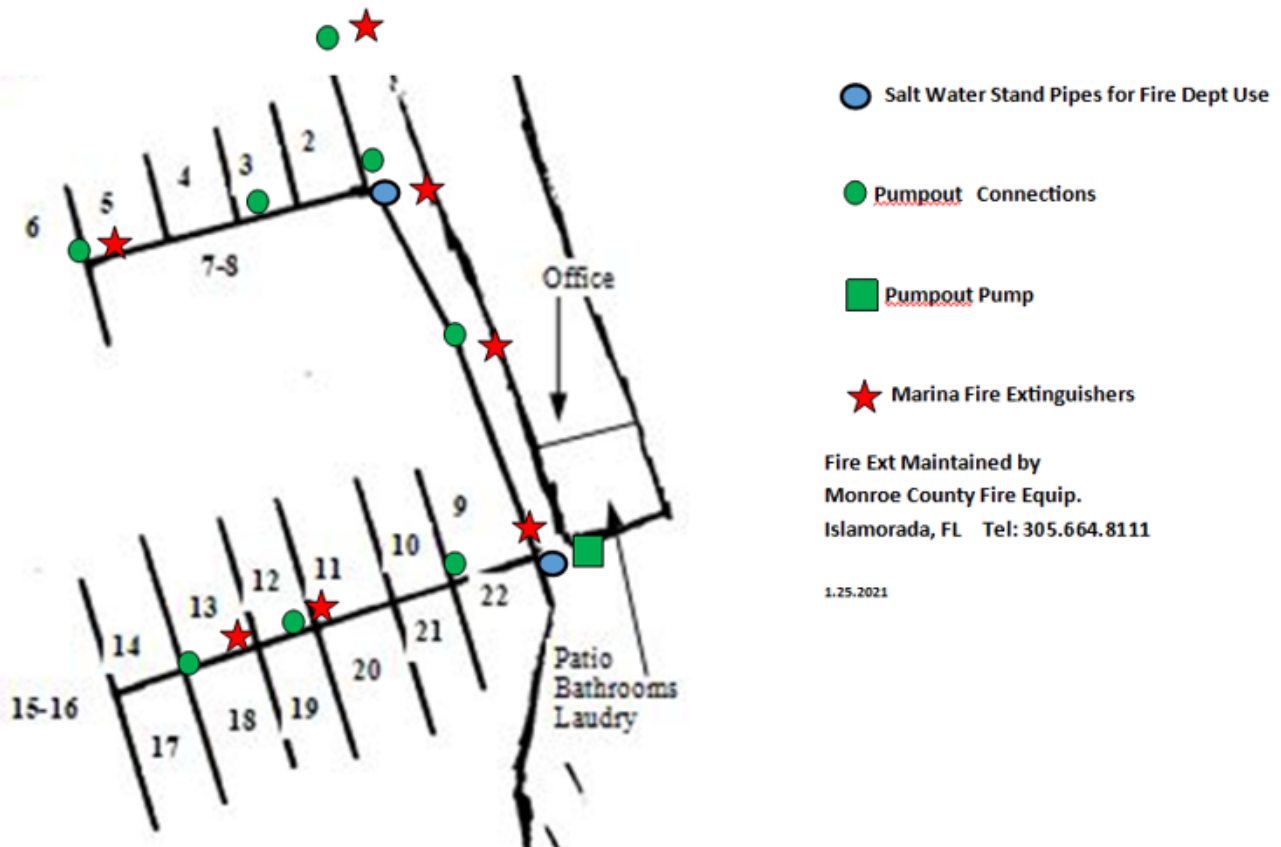
Alert all people to evacuate the dock immediately. Ask any boaters on docks to start sounding horns in repeated blasts of 5. Get everyone's attention. Pound on boats if safe.

Assign someone to direct emergency vehicles in from the 33rd St, rear parking lot is generally most accessible.

IF deemed safe - use water hose on dinghy dock or other slips to soak adjacent boats and also on the docks

USE FIRE EXTINGUISHERS ON DOCKS, if deemed safe to do so

Boat is at dock: Go back to previous page on “Dock Fire”

In addition to the emergency steps taken on the previous page of dock fire:

- Use **dock water hoses** to drench adjacent boats and dock, if safe to do so.
- Use fire extinguishers on docks to address the flames until Fire Dept arrives, if safe to do so.
- **For boats on the T-Docks of 6 and 15-16**, if weather conditions permit cut loose from dock and push out into open area. Consider the prevailing direction and strength of winds. DO NOT do this if winds are pushing the boats back onto the T-docks.
- For all other slips, regardless of weather, it is best to keep the boat in it's slip and fight it there.

Fuel Spills

Fuel Spill in the water

Gasoline:

Quantity under 1 quart

- 1) allow to evaporate
- 2) shut off electrical power to the nearest areas
- 3) guard the area until safe from fumes and fire

Quantity over 1 quart

- 1) deploy marina spill boom, add pillows as appropriate
* booms and pillows are located in locker in dock box, and white barrel on dinghy dock
- 2) shut off electrical power to the nearest areas
- 3) guard the area until cleared of fumes and contaminated materials
- 3) Report details to local U. S. Coast Guard at _305.743.1991_____

Diesel:

Any quantity that produces a “sheen” over 1 sq. yard

- 1) Deploy marina spill boom, add pillows as appropriate
* booms and pillows are located in locker in the containers on dinghy dock
- 2) Exclude boats and swimmers from containment zone
- 3) Report details to local U. S. Coast Guard at _305.743.1991_____
